During this block, students participate in teacher led inquiry, voluntary free reading, voluntary free writing, and small group activities. Teachers will conference with students individually once a week, to ensure the teacher led inquiry and small group activities are meeting the needs of all students.  Students will learn who the people in their family are, where they were born and raised and how they are related to each other Students will understand how they, their family and friends commemorate past events that are important to them Students will explore how the stories of families and the past can be communicated, for example, through photographs, artefacts, books, oral histories, digital media and museums Students will have the opportunity to present narratives, information and findings in oral, graphic and written forms using simple terms to denote the passing of time and to describe direction and location Through studies of their family, familiar people and their own history, students look at evidence of the past, exposing them to an early understanding that the past is different from the present (continuity and change). They come to understand why some events are important in their own and others' lives (significance), and how different people commemorate events that are important to them (empathy, perspectives). 		 Students will learn to think about colour choice, staying in the lines, pencil grip and pencil control. Students will learn to correctly handle scissors, safety, scissor grip and scissor control Students will complete various craft activities, integrated throughout all units. Performing Arts: The first three weeks of Term 1 will focus on students learning "The Mexican Hat Dance" to be performed at the SJA Multicultural Twilight FETE. Students will describe the effect of the elements in dance they make, they will perform and view where and why people dance? The rest of the Term will focus on a unit called "Movements and Emotions" which explores the role of dramatic action in dramatic play, improvisation and processes in drama.
